Registration:

Weston Parks and Recreation WOW! Program online registration will open on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>February 13th at 10:01 p.m.</u> If a program is full, you still may register and your child's name will automatically be placed on the wait-list (<u>No payment is required at this time</u>). If space does become available, you will be notified via email.

IMPORTANT NOTE: To create an account, click <u>here</u>, where you will be able to add <u>all</u> family members to your account before registration opens on **Tuesday**, **February 13th at 10:01 p.m.**

Note: If you already have an account with Weston Parks & Recreation, you're all set, but please double check that your child's grade is correct and that you've added any family members if they are currently not on your account.

Fees:

Payment:

- <u>ALL</u> payments must be made online by credit card via our secure site.
- Full payment of program fees must be made at time of registration.

Refund:

Once a class begins, we <u>do not</u> issue refunds or credits, unless with a doctor's note.

Program Dates:

Classes begin the week of April 22nd and run through the week of May 27th.

Class Length:

All classes are scheduled from 3:15 p.m. – 4:15 p.m. **unless otherwise noted.** Please check individual programs for program descriptions, grade eligibility, room assignments, start dates, and program end times.

Important information:

- Please be sure to log into The Dismissal Manager System <u>each week</u> to record your child(ren)'s WOW! after-school activity. Please note that the system allows you to record your child's activity for the entire session at one time and then make edits if, and when, necessary. Please indicate if anyone other than yourself will be picking up your child at dismissal time. <u>Additionally, given</u> <u>our unpredictable Weston weather, please indicate what your child's dismissal plans are in the event of an unplanned after school activities cancelation.</u>
- 2. In the event of an early dismissal due to inclement weather or any other school emergency, all after-school programs will be <u>canceled</u> and the children will be sent home per school policy. In the event of a cancelation, we will send a reminder via email and also post this information on the Weston Parks and Recreation WOW website. If we are unable to contact you in the case of a last minute cancellation by an instructor, children will stay in the main office with the WOW! Supervisor until a parent arrives. We will make every effort to make up missed classes due to cancelations.
- 3. There is <u>no</u> nurse on duty after normal school hours. In the event of illness or emergency treatment, we will call 911 and then contact parents, or the emergency contact if necessary.
- 4. If your child has any special medical needs, please contact Charlene Monn at 203-222-2586 prior or email <u>cmonn@westonct.gov</u> before the start of the session.
- 5. Weston Parks and Recreation reserves the right to cancel a class due to lack of student enrollment. If insufficient enrollment causes an activity to be canceled, participants will receive a full refund.
- 6. If a student is dismissed for disciplinary reasons or withdraws from the school or the program, the parent forfeits the entire program fee.

Health & Safety:

Please note that the pandemic may cause changes in our operations that are unpredictable. Our inperson WOW! after school programs will follow guidelines established by the Connecticut Department of Public Health, our local health district and the Weston Public School District. We'll continue to adjust our health and safety policies and procedures as updates become available.
