Connecticut is currently allowing people age 65+ to register for a COVID-19 vaccine

This week Governor Lamont released a schedule for the vaccine rollout plan moving forward, the schedule is primarily age based and is as follows:

- March 1, 2021: Expands to age group 55 to 64
- March 22, 2021: Expands to age group 45 to 54
- April 12, 2021: Expands to age group 35 to 44
- May 3, 2021: Expands to age group 16 to 34
