

Hello Weston. First Selectwoman Sam Nestor here with an important Covid update.

This week there is an increase of 6 individuals from October 22, 2021 to October 29, 2021. Up 8 cases in the past 2 weeks. The total accumulated Covid numbers for Weston are at 711.

The Town has a temporary mask mandate that was put into place on Monday, August 23, 2021. With the CDC advisors recently recommending booster doses of the Moderna and Johnson and Johnson COVID-19 vaccines, the Westport Weston Health District is having a drive-thru booster clinic.

- Where: 180 Bayberry Lane
- Date: Saturday, November 13th,
- Time: 10am-4pm.

This clinic will be for the eligible groups as outlined by the CDC. These are adult boosters only, not 1st, 2nd, or 3rd dose. For further information, please visit their website <http://wwhd.org/>
This clinic will be registered through VAMS.

Please note the graph - as of 10/28 Weston has moved out of the high spread / red category and into the substantial spread/orange category.

- Booster shots are available to the following groups for those who originally had the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine
 - At least 6 months after initial doses
 - 65+
 - Long term care residents
 - 18-64 with underlying conditions
 - 18+ with high risk of exposure
- Booster shots are available for those that had the one shot J&J
 - At least 2 months after initial dose
 - 18+

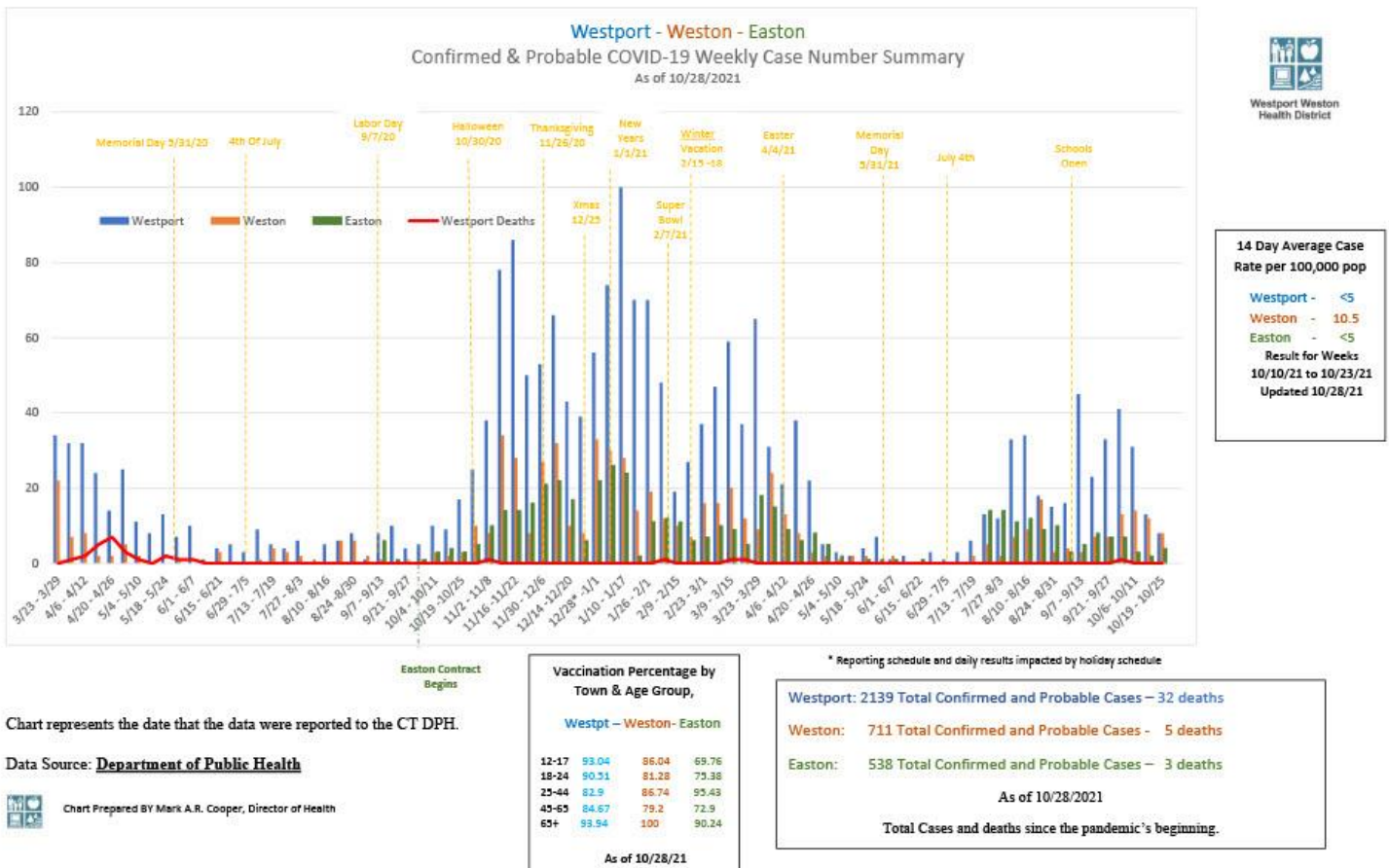


Chart represents the date that the data were reported to the CT DPH.
