

Hello Weston. First Selectwoman Sam Nestor here with an important Covid update.

**This week there is an increase of 3 individuals from October 29, 2021 to November 11, 2021. Up 3 cases in the past 2 weeks. The total accumulated Covid numbers for Weston are at 714.**

Weston remains in the “grey” zone with less than 5 cases over the past 2 weeks. Fully vaccinated rates continue to creep up.

Please note the local mask mandate has been lifted as of November 5, 2021. However masks are still required in all Town owned properties as well as at Weston Schools.

With the CDC advisors recently recommending booster doses of the Moderna and Pfizer COVID-19 vaccines, the Westport Weston Health District is having a drive-thru booster clinic.

  - At least 6 months after initial doses
  - 65+
  - Long term care residents
  - 18-64 with underlying conditions
  - 18+ with high risk of exposure
- Booster shots are available for those that had the one shot J&J
  - At least 2 months after initial dose

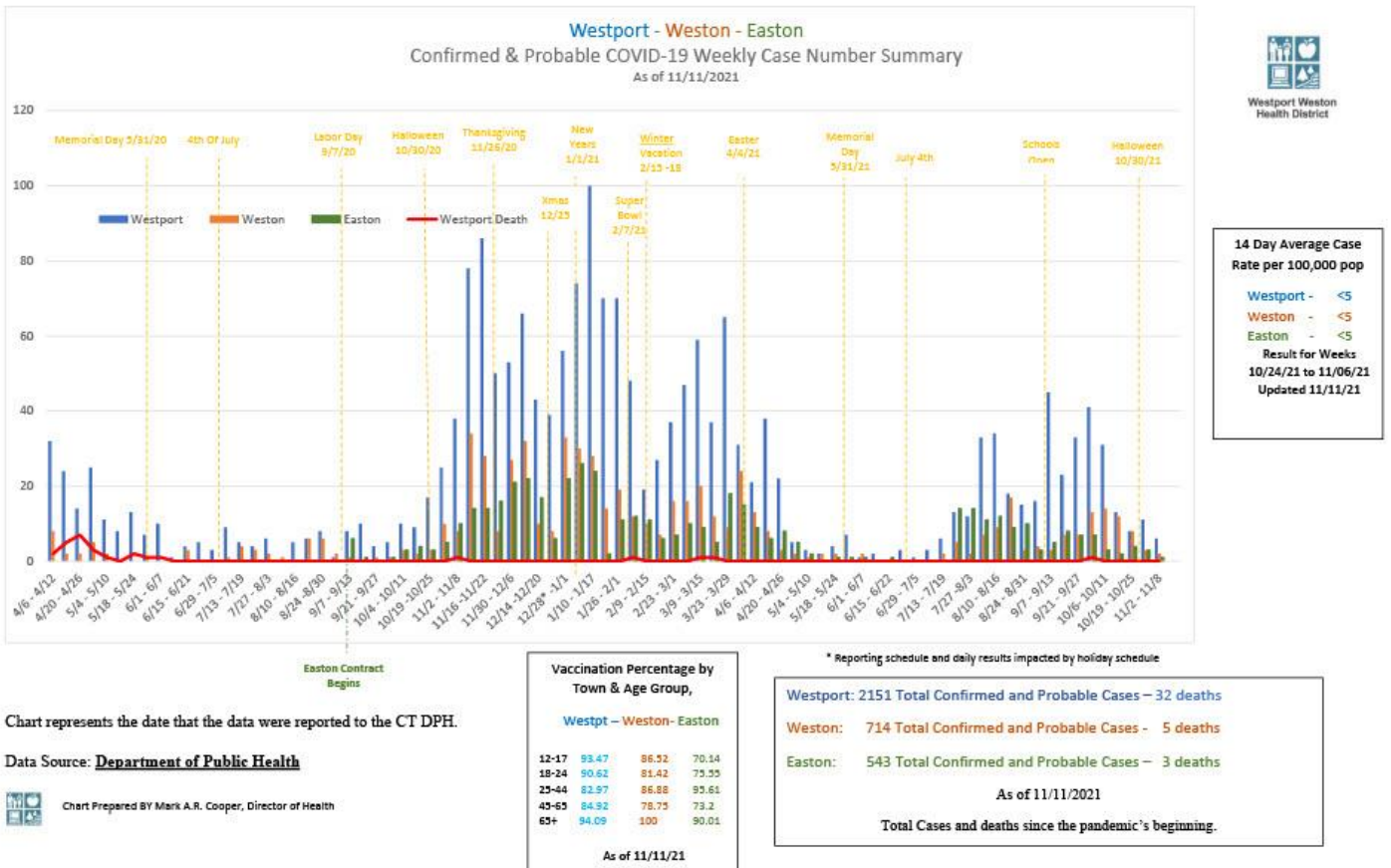


Chart represents the date that the data were reported to the CT DPH.
